The Capital Area Soccer League (CASL), based in Raleigh, is one of the largest and most successful soccer organizations of its kind in the United States. Founded in 1974, CASL is home to more than 20,000 players, coaches and volunteers and 800 local youth teams. In addition, CASL also creates and hosts some of the most highly-regarded youth soccer tournaments in country. The centerpiece event is the CASL visitRaleigh.com National Soccer Series (NSS). The NSS features four tournaments over a five-week stretch each fall. Annually more than 1,000 teams from 40 states traveled to North Carolina for the National Soccer Series, further establishing Greater Raleigh's reputation as "America's Soccer Capital."






