The Longwood Progressive Meeting, built in 1855, was the gathering place for Progressive Quakers who were activists in the Underground Railroad and other social causes of the day. In 1989, the Chester County Conference and Visitors Bureau moved into the building for use as a tourist information center. In 2014, the Visitors Bureau moved the administrative team into the building as it continues to house the Visitors Center.



n 1906, industrialist Pierre S. du Pont (1870-1954) purchased a small farm near Kennett Square, Pa., to save a collection of historic trees from being sold for lumber. Today, Longwood Gardens is one of the world's great gardens, encompassing 1,077 acres of dazzling gardens, woodlands, meadows, a 10,010-pipe Aeolian organ and 4.5-acre conservatory. In addition, Longwood is home to the most significant fountain collection in North America and is poised to reopen the jewel of that collection, the Main Fountain Garden, on May 27, 2017, after a two-year, \$90 million revitalization. It is amazing to look back at the genius of du Pont's vision and the legacy that Longwood so fiercely champions.





Longwood Founder Pierre S. du Pont unveiled the Main Fountain Garden in 1931. The revitalized Main Fountain Garden will return in May and feature a variety of new fountain features and technologies, including the basket weave nozzle, shown above in early testing.


In 1931, du Pont unveiled the Main Fountain Garden at Longwood inspired by the fountains he had seen in the grand gardens of Europe and at the 1893 World Columbian Exposition in Chicago. These magnificent fountains have stood the test of time. Through the years, there have been repairs and upgrades but nothing of this scope and magnitude. Gradually, concerns with the deteriorating structure lead to the elimination of certain water features and limited access to several garden areas. Finally, in 2014, after years of meticulous planning, construction began on Longwood's

most ambitious project since the founder's passing in 1954, New Heights: The Fountain Revitalization Project. The plan preserves the original components of the garden while adding new areas for guests to explore while utilizing modern technology. Much of the overall work is underground, incorporating 1,400 linear feet of tunnels that serve as the backbone of the Main Fountain Garden, supporting the spectacular infrastructure for its collection of pipes, pumps, pools, basins, fountainheads and lighting. The fountains will soar as high as 175 feet and recirculate more

New LED lighting will make infinite color combinations possible during illuminated fountain performances. A sophisticated tunnel structure beneath the Main Fountain Garden houses the plumbing, electrical, fountain and mechanical infrastructure, enabling easy access for maintenance.

than 31,000 gallons of water each minute. Energy-efficient LED lights in myriad colors will illuminate the fountains in an amazing show.

One of the major elements of the revitalization is the restoration of more than 4,000 pieces of Italian and Indiana limestone, which form the garden fountains, walls and ornamentation. Master craftsmen have meticulously returned the limestone to its glory, utilizing both artistry and technology.



New Heights was to encourage guests to explore the garden. With this in mind, the garden has been redesigned to include an elaborate and expansive boxwood hedge, additional pathways and custom-designed benches, creating an immersive, welcoming, accessible five-acre garden. To support the increased guest access, in true Longwood ingenuity, a special soil mix was designed.

Longwood continues the mission set forth by du Pont to inspire people through excellence in garden design, horticulture, education and the performing arts and through programming that includes exhibitions, musical performances, environmental stewardship and community engagement. The revitalized Main Fountain Garden is a shining example of du Pont's enduring legacy — one that will bring joy to guests at Longwood Gardens for generations to come.





A Revolution

240th Anniversary of the Campaign of 1777



n July 4, 1776, the 13 colonies declared their independence from Great Britain. One month later, 30,000 British troops landed in New York and then drove General George Washington's army from the city. By the spring of 1777, General Sir William Howe's plan to capture the American capital of

Philadelphia had been approved. In July 1777, General Howe's army of some 15,000 men embarked from the New York area on 260 ships to attack the colonial capital. After six weeks at sea, Howe's force landed near Elkton, Md. During the month of September, approximately 30,000 British and American soldiers moved through Chester County and faced each other in major engagements. On September 11, 1777, Howe's army launched a two-pronged attack from Kennett Square and successfully flanked Washington's troops during the Battle of Brandywine. The two armies next faced each other on September 16 in what is known as the Battle of the Clouds, near present-day Immaculata University, but a violent storm made any fighting impossible. Washington moved a large portion of his army toward northern Chester County in mid-September to protect crucial supply depots. The final major encounter in Chester County is known as the Paoli Massacre, which took place on September 20 in modern-day Malvern. Philadelphia was captured September 26. The two armies fought again at Germantown on October 4 and along the Delaware River. Washington's army then spent the winter at Valley Forge while the British Army occupied Philadelphia. Chester County's Town Tours & Village Walks program will commemorate these events in the summer of 2017.





A restored 19th-century gristmill graces the banks of the beautiful Brandywine River. This is the home of the Brandywine River Museum of Art, a treasure known internationally for its collections of works by the Wyeth family along with a fine collection of American illustrations, still lifes and landscapes. The museum showcases the work of three generations of the Wyeth family: N.C., Andrew and Jamie.


From June 24 through September 17, the museum will present "Andrew Wyeth: In Retrospect," a oncein-a-lifetime exhibition of iconic works by this master painter, commemorating the centennial of the artist's birth. The Brandywine is the only East Coast venue for the exhibition. It extends from World War I — Wyeth was born in 1917, and his imagination was shaped by war imagery — to the new millennium and Wyeth's death in 2009.




Andrew Wyeth in his studio with "Tenant Farmer" on the easel, ca. 1961.






Andrew Wyeth's painting "The Drifter" is featured on the cover of the catalogue for the exhibition "Andrew Wyeth: In Retrospect."







Brandywine River Museum of Art, the exhibition includes more than 100 works, from the early watercolors that quickly established his reputation to his final completed tempera, "Goodbye."

"Andrew Wyeth: In Retrospect" explores the impact of time and place on Wyeth's work and challenges the notion that his career was a seamless narrative that stood isolated from outside cultural forces. The exhibition will offer new interpretations on the significance of influences on his work, such as film and the images of war, and on the relatively unstudied but numerous portrayals of African-Americans from the Chadds Ford community.

Visitors will glimpse Wyeth's working process through the inclusion of his studies for specific tempera paintings. These studies were typically made in watercolor or pencil and were rarely exhibited in his lifetime.





ISSUES A PANE
OF STAMPS

In 2017, the United States Postal Service will issue a pane of stamps inspired by the art of Andrew Wyeth to commemorate the centennial of the artist's birth. Wyeth was born and spent his life in Chadds Ford, Pa., home of the Brandywine River Museum of Art. The official dedication ceremony for the stamps will take place at the Brandywine River Museum of Art on Wednesday, July 12, 2017, at 10 a.m., 100 years to the day that Andrew Wyeth was born. This event is free and open to the public.





Museum of Art by Andrew's wife, Betsy James Wyeth, the studio has undergone restoration to preserve its appearance to the time when it was used by the late artist. It was opened to the public in the summer of 2012. The original structure, a schoolhouse, was built in 1875 and was Wyeth's home for more than two decades. He and his wife raised their two boys, Jamie and Nicholas, here, and Jamie's first studio was also in the family home. Many of Jamie Wyeth's early works were created here, including his posthumous portrait of John F. Kennedy. Andrew Wyeth painted in the studio from 1940 until 2008, and thousands of works are associated with the building and surrounding landscape. His library, photos, film collection, costumes and props are some of the fascinating objects on the tour.

Two additional tours are available and complement the life of this extraordinary man and his work. Andrew's childhood home and his father's studio are the focus of N.C. Wyeth's House & Studio Tour, and the Kuerner Farm tour

takes visitors to the site where a young Andrew found an abundance of inspiration (resulting in nearly 1,000 paintings and drawings). The three sites are within minutes of the Brandywine River Museum of Art, and a complimentary shuttle bus provides transportation from the museum to each site. Each tour is approximately one hour in length and requires a separate ticket. b






BIKE THE BRANDYWINE
