

TRADITIONS

The 12th Man is a well-known Aggie tradition. It all began January 2, 1922 during an injury-filled football game. Coach Dana X. Bible called down E. King Gill from the press box to suit up in case of another injury. Gill never made it on to the field, but he stood on the sidelines the entire game. After the Aggies won the game, he said, "I wish I could say that I went in and ran for the winning touchdown, but I didn't. I simply got ready and waited – just in case I was needed." Because of E. King Gill, the student body stands for the entire game to show they are ready to enter the game if needed.

Another sacred tradition is the tradition of the Aggie ring. Ring day in Aggieland might be the best day of an Aggie's life. There are many symbols on the ring, many of them emphasizing integrity, character, and the dual allegiance to the United States and Texas. The Aggie ring is one of the key components to that unbreakable Aggie Network.

team played their biggest rival, the University of Texas. Sadly in 1999, 12 Aggies lost their lives when the bonfire fell during construction. Since this tragedy, the bonfire is no longer held on campus. Today, in the same place where bonfire was built on campus, a beautiful memorial with 12 stone pillars stands honoring the 12 fallen Aggies.

ARCHIVES AND RESEARCH

Like the other Presidential Libraries, the George Bush Presidential Library and Museum is also a research institution. The library's holdings include more than 44 million pages of official records and personal papers; 2 million photographs; and thousands of hours of videotape and audio recordings; as well as a small collection of Federal Records and more than 70 donated collections. These materials are preserved and made available for research and museum exhibitions. Together, they document the life and career of George Bush and form an important historical record of the critical years in the late 20th century.

EDUCATION

The museum has a classroom, the first of its kind in a Presidential Library, designed specifically for students in kindergarten through high school. A staff education coordinator combines Texas and national social studies curriculum with drama, art and written expression to create programs that teach students about the presidency, American history and government. Each year thousands of students participate in the library's education programs in the classroom, museum and online through distance learning.

EVENTS

In early summer, join the festivities for the combined birthday of George and Barbara Bush. Past celebrations have included President Bush's tandem skydive jump, live entertainment, birthday cake, Blue Bell ice cream, and fun for the whole family. Join the museum for a 4th of July celebration with a fireworks show that will not disappoint! Other annual events celebrate Presidents Day, Easter, Veterans Day and Holidays in the Rotunda. The Bush Center also hosts world-class speakers such as diplomats, politicians and leaders in business and government.

ATTRACTIONS

ARTS COUNCIL OF BRAZOS VALLEY

The Arts Council is a multifaceted organization supporting over 60 affiliate arts and cultural organizations and all residents and visitors to the Brazos Valley. The Arts Council's Texas Gallery hosts seven exhibitions annually featuring works from local, regional, and national artists. These exhibitions include painting, photography, sculpture, fiber arts and a variety of mixed media. Seven community galleries at large, placed throughout the region, rotate the work of local artists every two morths. Stop by The Arts Center to learn more about the vibrant arts community, purchase a ticket to a local theater production, or browse the Artisans' Corner gift shop!

BENJAMIN KNOX GALLERY-COLLEGE STATION DEPOT

Experience the home gallery, fine artwork, and custom framing of nationally renowned artist Benjamin Knox. The gallery is located in a replica of the College Station Train Depot from the 1900's. This facility is also available for special event rental.

BRAZOS VALLEY AFRICAN AMERICAN MUSEUM

The African American Museum chronicles the tragedies and triumphs of African American life from ancient civilizations to the present day, while also focusing on local histories of churches, families, and schools. The museum strives to explore, develop, preserve and present the cultural heritage of African Americans.

BRAZOS VALLEY MUSEUM OF NATURAL HISTORY

The Museum promotes natural and cultural history and science education through engaging exhibits, classes, programs & events for all ages, outreach activities, and the preservation of artifacts and specimens. New exhibits on a large variety of topics, often incorporating original art and photography, open quarterly, and the Museum's gallery also features exhibits of dinosaur and ice Age fossils; a beautiful ice Age Mural of the Brazos Valley, Brazos Spring; local and Texas history; and geologic specimens.



The Museum's Discovery Room features live animals, an observational bee hive, dozens of taxidermy mounts, a fascinating butterfly and insect exhibit, and educational resources. The Museum also exhibits a Texas State Archeology Landmark Collection of Clovis projectile points, Native American "Singing Mothers" pottery, ammonites, and many other items. Birthday parties and private programs are also available by reservation. The Museum hosts a small library open to the public and a gift shop showcasing unique items from local artists including pottery, jewelry, baskets, and also specialty books, toys, rocks, and other artistic novelty items.

THE CARNEGIE CENTER OF THE BRAZOS VALLEY

Built in 1903 with funds from the Carnegie Foundation, this library is the oldest existing Carnegie Library in Texas. The library features a state-of-the-art history lab, historical documents and periodicals, rare books, portraits, photographs and memorabilia relating to the ballet career of Ana Ludmila Gee. The second floor of the center houses an extensive genealogical collection.

THE CHILDREN'S MUSEUM OF THE BRAZOS VALLEY

The Children's Museum of the Brazos Valley is an interactive and educational museum where kids learn through play with hands-on activities. Current exhibits include: an HEB grocery store for exploration of the world of commerce, a Build Your World exhibit that teaches about construction, building, and tools, a Healthy Kids exhibit where children learn that living a healthy lifestyle can be easy and fun, and "Mrs. Giggley's Garden," a toddler exhibit so the youngest learners can explore through sensory learning. Daily interactive programs led by museum staff, birthday parties, and special events make The Children's Museum the one-stop shop for fun and learning.

TEXAS A&M UNIVERSITY ATTRACTIONS

ABOUT TEXAS A&M UNIVERSITY

Texas A&M University is a land-grant, sea-grant and space-grant institution located in College Station, Texas. The University's enrollment is more than 49,000 students studying for degrees in 10 academic colleges. Tours of the campus are offered through the Appelt Aggieland Visitor Center Tours.

APPELT AGGIELAND VISITORS CENTER

The Visitor Center is located on the 1st floor of Rudder tower on campus and offers visitors a 90-minute walking or driving tour of the campus highlighting the history and traditions that make Texas A&M such an unique experience.

BONFIREMEMORIAL

The memorial is dedicated to the 12 Aggies who lost their lives in the tragic collapse of the 1999 Bonfire. It celebrates the tradition and history of Texas A&M and is comprised of the Tradition Plaza, Spirit Wall, and History Walk.

CUSHING MEMORIAL LIBRARY AND ARCHIVES

In addition to housing Texas A&M University's rare books, special collections and archives, Cushing Memorial Library and Archives presents 4-6 exhibits for visitors each year. Paintings and other works from Cushing's extensive art collections in addition to rare books and other historic materials are always on display.

FORSYTH GALLERIES

As the home of the Bill ("35) & Irma Runyon Art Collections, the galleries house one of the world's most extraordinary collections of English Cameo Glass, as well as 1,100 American and English glass objects, and 66 American paintings including important works by Mary Cassatt, Frederick Remington and Charles M. Russell. The glass collections include the mastery of Louis Comfort Tiffany, Steuben Glass Works, Mount Washington Glass Company, New England Glass Company and long-term loans of Galle and rich cut glass.


SAM HOUSTON SANDERS CORPS OF CADET CENTER

This center depicts the Corps of Cadets from its beginning in 1876 to today and describes the traditions and history of Texas A&M University. The exhibits include Silver Taps, the Aggie Band, Parsons Mounted Cavalry, the 12th Man, the Ross Volunteers, Aggie Muster, Bonfire, Reveille, Cadet life, and an Aggie Ring case. Another Aggieland must-see, Metzger-Sanders Antique Firearm Collection is also housed in the Corps Center.

TEXAS A&M ATHLETIC SPORTS MUSEUM

Located in the Zone of Kyle Field, this museum serves as a repository for treasured sports relics of the past. Visitors will experience several different exhibits in the museum including the Time Wall, Legends Gallery, sport-by-sport perimeter displays and interactive computers. The Texas A&M Sports Museum has the distinction of being the nation's only all-sports museum funded primarily by former athletes.














GETTING AROUND

From Austin:

Approximately 2 hours

From Austin-Bergstrom International Airport head east on Highway 71. Continue on Highway 71 until Bastrop. In Bastrop, turn left onto TX-21/TX-95. Less than a mile later, turn right onto Highway 21 East. Continue on Highway 21 East for approximately 65 miles, then exit right onto Highway 47. Highway 47 becomes F.M. 60 / Raymond Stotzer Parkway and this street will take you into College Station.

From Houston:

Approximately 1.5 hours

From Bush Intercontinental Airport take John F. Kennedy Blvd out of the airport. Turn onto the North Beltway 8/Sam Houston Toll Way going west. Exit 290 W toward Austin. Approximately 36 miles later take Highway 6 going north to Bryan. Highway 6 takes you all the way in to Bryan-College Station.

From Dallas/Fort Worth:

Approximately 3.5 hours

From the Dallas/Fort Worth International Airport head south on Highway 97 S. Take the TX-360/TX-183 exit toward Grand Prairie/Arlington. Take the TX-360/TX-183 exit toward Grand Prairie/Arlington. Merge onto I-820 S then take a Slight left at TX-121 S. After approximately 7 miles take the LEFT exit onto I-35W S toward Waco and continue to follow I-35W S. In Waco, take 339 for TX-340 Loop/FM-3051 toward Lake Shore Dr. Merge onto I-35 N. Turn right at N Loop 340. Turn left at S Lacy Dr/TX-491 and continue to follow TX-491. TX 941 merges into TX 484 E. Then TX 484 E merges into Highway 6. Follow Highway 6 south until Bryan-College Station.

From San Antonio:

Approximately 3.5 hours

From the San Antonio International Airport head east on Loop 410. Take the exit onto I-25 north toward Austin. In San Marcos take exit 205 toward East TX 80. Turn right onto TX 80 from the frontage road. From TX 80, turn left onto Highway 21. Exit from Highway 21 right onto Highway 47. Highway 47 becomes F.M. 60 / Raymond Stotzer Parkway and this street will take you into College Station.
