TO EXPERIENCE AMERICA'S TOP DOWNTOWN

Fort Worth has the #1 downtown in America, according to livability.com – and Sundance Square is the heart of downtown. This is the place to have a wonderful meal, shop at unique stores, see a great show and relax in Sundance Square Plaza. You can even park for free! Get all the details at **sundancesquare.com**.





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Downtown Fort Worth is buzzing with energy both day and night. In fact, livability.com recently named it the top downtown in America in 2014.

BURNETT PARK

This beautiful, two-acre park surrounded by downtown high-rises has play areas, a "great lawn," bistro-style tables and chairs, and one of the most distinctive public art pieces in the city: *Man with a Briefcase*.

JFK TRIBUTE

President John F. Kennedy spent his last night in downtown Fort Worth and spoke to a huge crowd the next morning. This stirring tribute includes a larger-than-life statue, historical photos and quotations from JFK.



FORT WORTH CENTRAL LIBRARY

Explore the wonderful world of books at the large kids' area in the Fort Worth Central Library. The library also hosts regular story times, exhibitions and other activities and programs that encourage reading.



SUNDANCE SOUARE PLAZA

Opened in 2013, this fabulous outdoor space is a model of urban revitalization and has become the heart of downtown. The entertainment/business district boasts delightful shopping, 30-plus restaurants, performance and movie theaters, art galleries and more. The Plaza also features sparkling fountains, giant umbrellas and the historic *Chisholm Trail Mural*, as well as places to relax and peoplewatch. Seasonal activities include concerts, movies, yoga classes and more.

BIKE SHARING

Downtown has several spots to pick up or drop off a B-cycle, including Sundance Square, City Place, the Central Library and the Omni Hotel Fort Worth.



HIDDEN GEM

Public art in its finest definition, the Fort Worth Water Gardens exists as one of architect Philip Johnson's finest creations, an asymmetrical and angular design of multiple levels comprising walkways, terraces, green spaces and three distinct pools – the aerating, the quiet and the active – accompanied by a symphony of rushing water.



SELFIE STOP

Stand in Sundance Plaza and choose your backdrop, whether that's the historic Tarrant County Courthouse's beautiful clock tower, the Plaza's dancing fountains, the wave wall fountain or the mesmerizing *Chisholm Trail Mural*. **#FortWorthSelfie**



What's hotter: the authentic Havana décor or the salsa dancers on the dance floor? Step up to the bar — inlaid with vintage cigar-box lids — and order up authentic Cuban food and cocktails.



FOUR DAY WEEKEND

Ready to be part of the show? This hilarious comedy troupe performs an improvised show every Friday and Saturday night, complete with audience participation.



SCAT JAZZ LOUNGE

Head into the alley and down to the basement, and find yourself in one of the coolest jazz clubs in America — a swanky stage for local and national jazz musicians of all stripes.



SUNDANCE SQUARE

Shopping downtown is big fun, and the charming streets of Sundance Square are packed with specialty boutiques, gift shops and galleries, restaurants, bars and entertainment venues, 35 blocks worth. Tip: Valet park for free with validation.



PETER BROS. HATS Started in 1911, Peter Bros. has been creating custom, high-quality hats for generations. Amon Carter used to give away these hats to movie stars and celebrities when they visited Fort Worth.



KIMBELL ART MUSEUM SHOP

If you can't make it to the museum, try this specialty shop in the Omni Fort Worth Hotel. You'll find a unique selection of art books, decorative items, jewelry and gifts.



BASS PERFORMANCE HALL

This world-class performance space is home to the Fort Worth Symphony Orchestra, Fort Worth Opera, the Texas Ballet Theater and the Cliburn Concerts, as well as touring performers and Broadway shows.

JUBILEE THEATRE

This African-American theatre troupe has been pleasing multi-cultural audiences for years with a big variety of plays, from hilarious musicals to serious drama.

SID RICHARDSON MUSEUM

View an amazing collection of Western art, featuring the works of Frederic Remington and Charles M. Russell, as well as their contemporaries. Admission is free. This casual, community-oriented district, sometimes called "**Magnolia**," is packed with locally owned music venues, shops, bars and eateries. It's home to one of the finest restaurant rows in Fort Worth.



SHIPPING & RECEIVING

A bar on the National Register of Historic Places? Yep. At Shipping & Receiving, you can grab a brew, sit outdoors and watch a premier North Texas band.

THE BEARDED LADY

Opened in 2014, The Bearded Lady has quickly become a local favorite for craft beer and pub food. For the full experience, snag a picnic table seat and soak up the Magnolia street life.

LIVE OAK

This popular concert hall showcases marquee-name touring acts in a 500-seat auditorium. For stellar views and inventive food and drink, head upstairs to the rooftop patio.

THE USUAL

Slip into a retro, wraparound booth and order up a Prohibition-era cocktail. The way-cool décor, drinks and crowd at this hot spot are anything but the usual.



JUSTIN BOOT OUTLET

Fort Worth is the home of the Justin Boot Company, renowned worldwide for their boot-making skills. Step into this outlet store and you'll find everything from classic cowboy boots to work boots at deep discounts.

1208 BUILDING

A fun variety of small pop-up boutiques — including Ephemera, Hudson Studios, 2econd Chances and Two Birds, One Stone — are housed in the beautifully restored 1208 Building.

PENDERY'S WORLD OF CHILI AND SPICES

Cooking enthusiasts will revel in the flavor-packed shelves at Pendery's, where you can find the most comprehensive spice selection. Pendery's has been the go-to spice shop in Fort Worth for over 130 years.

DICKIES FACTORY OUTLET

Dickies headquarters is located on Vickery Street, and there's a factory outlet store right next door where you can get bargains on Dickies gear of all varieties.



AMPHIBIAN STAGE PRODUCTIONS

The Amphibian company has a reputation for innovative and challenging theater — one play was performed entirely in the dark!

ARTS FIFTH AVENUE

The very definition of eclectic, Arts Fifth Avenue delivers a dizzying variety of performances and festivals featuring music, visual arts and dance. They also offer classes in performing and visual arts from ages 4 and up.

STAGE WEST

For almost 35 years, Stage West has brought professional, Actors' Equity theater to Fort Worth audiences. Whether they're presenting Shakespeare and Shaw or a new experimental drama, the productions are always top-notch.

MAGNOLIA GREEN

You never know what you'll find at this pretty, one-acre park: food trucks, a full-on music festival or just a few folks relaxing and enjoying the scenery.

BIKE SHARING

The Near Southside has abundant B-Cycle locations, including three on Magnolia at Lipscomb, Henderson and Hurley.

MELT ICE CREAMS

Opened in 2014, this "farmto-cone" creamery conjures unexpected flavors – Velvet Vegan, anyone? Sourced from local ingredients, a few bites will make you, well, melt.

SINACA STUDIOS

SiNaCa is a public glass studio offering classes and workshops in all forms of glass techniques, from blown glass to kiln-worked. Check out the gallery for works that will blow your mind.

THISTLE HILL & BALL-EDDLEMAN-MCFARLAND HOUSE

Thistle Hill is a three-story Georgian Revival mansion built in 1903 for the eccentric daughter of a cattle baron. Ball-Eddleman-McFarland House, built in 1899, is one of the many Victorian homes of the cattle baron. Both structures offer a throwback to the grand lifestyle of another era.



HIDDEN GEM

The always-crowded, BYOB jewel box of a restaurant on West Magnolia, Nonna Tata speaks of owner-chef Donatella Trotti's passion for the exquisite, handmade dishes of her family's home near Lake Como in northern Italy.



SELFIE STOP

Take a seat inside Brewed, considered the locals' living room for the Near Southside District, and snap yourself sipping a cup of Thai coffee, quaffing a glass of locally made kombucha, sampling a pint of locally brewed Revolver Blood & Honey or nibbling a lemon tart with goat cheese ice cream. **#FortWorthSelfie**

TCU / Z00

The purple pride of **Texas Christian University (TCU)** has been a part of Fort Worth for over 100 years. The beautiful campus and lively district are located half a mile from the **Fort Worth Zoo** and less than five miles from Downtown/Sundance Square.



THE AARDVARK

A longtime TCU-area hangout, The Aardvark is a popular choice for live music. It has a reputation for booking solid, up-and-coming bands: rock, country, indie and everything in between.



BUFFALO BROS.

This simple, comfortable bar and restaurant caters to TCU sports fans, with TVs in every direction and bar food imported from Buffalo, New York, including wings (of course), beef on weck and bison French onion dip.



PIZZA SNOB The don't-play-with-your-food rule goes out the window at Pizza Snob, where you're encouraged to experiment with a variety of toppings to build your own delicious pizza.



TCU OFFICIAL BOOKSTORE

It's not just about textbooks. This is the go-to place for TCU Horned Frog apparel for the whole family, as well as TCU-themed gifts and game-day accessories.



UNIVERSITY PARK VILLAGE

This pretty, open-air shopping center is home to stores like the Apple Store, J. Crew, Anthropologie, Banana Republic, Pottery Barn and Williams-Sonoma.



UNIVERSITY PUB Known simply as "The Pub," this

TCU favorite is just a frog's jump from campus. It's small, laid-back and friendly, with cheap drinks and a distinctly collegiate feel.



TCU ART GALLERIES

The Art Galleries at TCU – Moudy Gallery and Fort Worth Contemporary Arts – offer a series of exhibitions, lectures, panel discussions and other programs that engage the university community with the general public.



FORT WORTH ZOO

One of the top five zoos in the nation, the Fort Worth Zoo is home to more than 7,000 native and exotic animals. Cleverly designed exhibits let you get up-close to the animals, including two baby elephants.



LOG CABIN VILLAGE

This authentic mid-19th-century village has a blacksmith shop, one-room schoolhouse, pioneer garden, smokehouse and several historic furnished log-cabin homes, along with historical interpreters in pioneer clothing.



MONNIG METEORITE GALLERY

Want to touch a piece of Mars? You can at the Monnig Meteorite Gallery, which houses one of the largest university-based meteorite collections in the world.



CLEARFORK FOOD PARK This big, dog-friendly food park is located just off University

is located just off University Drive, right on the Trinity River. In addition to revolving food trucks, there's a permanent cantina serving beer and wine.





Texas Christian University is one of the most picturesque small universities in the nation. Get a glimpse of university life with a jaunt through campus, or grab some tickets to a high-energy sporting event.



BIKE SHARING Hop on a B-Cycle on the TCU Campus, at West Berry and University, or at the Trailhead at Clearfork.



HIDDEN GEM

Since 1959, families have loved boarding the Forest Park Miniature Railroad, making 40-minute round-trips along a five-mile loop from the depot, next to the famous zoo, to the Trinity Park Duck Pond, crossing the Clear Fork of the Trinity River on its route.



SELFIE STOP

Head to the Campus Commons on the TCU Campus and stand facing west in front of Frog Fountain, with "Texas Christian University" on the wall just behind you, water splashing down the four stylized leaves above you and, as a distant backdrop, the student center with its tower. **#FortWorthSelfie** "Fort Worth is home even for people visiting the city. It's an incredibly welcoming place; it relaxes you, willing you to stay for as long as you want."

Once a huge Montgomery Ward Department Store, this is now a mixeduse development with local and national stores and many family-friendly dining spots.



TORNADO SCULPTURE

At the intersection of Camp Bowie and University, these four steel beams (which once held a billboard) were twisted and bent by the powerful winds of the 2000 Fort Worth tornado.

FORT WORTH FOOD PARK

The city's first food park lets you sample a range of cuisines in a serene setting. Food trucks like Bombay Chopstix and Cajun Tailgators rotate daily.

BIKE SHARING

Pick up or drop off a B-Cycle on West 7th at Norwood, Stayton and Woolery.



HIDDEN GEM

Intentionally understated, Revolver Taco Lounge brings stylish specialties from Mexico's interior to the plate in the form of delectable, delicate tacos cradling tender pork tidbits with pineapple and salsa; ceviche blending red snapper, habanero and orange; chile relleno bathed in walnut cream; and duck breast enveloped in a deep red mole.



SELFIE STOP

When visiting the Movie Tavern, head to its rooftop parking garage for a primo downtown view, with the Trinity Park treetops and soaring arches of the new 7th Street Bridge directly behind you and the looming white Montgomery Plaza (and its glowing red letters) on the left. **#FortWorthSelfie**



CAPITAL BAR

Capital Bar boasts an enormous "backyard" party deck with a full-size stage, plus a rooftop patio with terrific views of downtown and the Cultural District.

BAR LOUIE

This neighborhood bar offers upbeat surroundings with an extensive selection of appetizers and entrees, plus a wide assortment of martinis, microbrews and wines by the glass or bottle.

LOLA'S SALOON

Live bands play to enthusiastic audiences at this old-school venue, which has sprawling front and back patios, Texas-brewed beers on tap and locals from all walks of life.

MAGNOLIA MOTOR LOUNGE

When you're hungry for burgers or blues, steer over to this auto-themed lounge, which cranks up the live music every night of the week.

LANDMARK BAR

Vintage arcade games, a mechanical bull, cold craft beer, live bands and a sprawling patio have made Landmark a Fort Worth hot spot.



VAN GROW ART STUDIO

This creative art studio for your budding Michelangelo offers classes for children as young as two. Van Grow introduces kids to many artistic mediums, including paint, clay and collage.



FLIRT BOUTIQUE

Flirt delivers the latest trends without breaking budgets. When you need a break from trying on clothes, enjoy a glass of vino at the wine bar.

LANE-KNIGHT

A favorite spot for the fashion-forward, Lane-Knight offers a stylish assortment of clothing and accessories from established brands and rising designers.

TESKEY'S UPTOWN

A little bit cowboy and a little bit rock and roll, Teskey's Uptown is the citified version of the retailer's tack-and-saddle store in Weatherford. You'll find lots of brand names in furniture, clothing and accessories.

WRARE

A cool, urban vibe permeates this matchless shop, which boasts an artful collection of furniture, home accents and gifts, as well as design consultation and custom upholstery.

THE GINGERMAN

This homey neighborhood pub with an idyllic patio has more than 65 beers on draft and another 100 in bottles. There's also a hearty selection of "solids," including sandwiches and dips.

WINSLOW'S WINE CAFÉ

When you want a cozy spot for an intimate conversation, Winslow's is made to order. In addition to wines from all over the world, Winslow's offers a menu that changes with each season.

BAKER STREET PUB & GRILL

Inside, it's like Sherlock Holmes' London apartment, with dark wood paneling and antiques. Outside, there's a large patio where you can indulge in British ale and fish and chips.



A PIECE OF WORK

Ready to pick up a brush? This "interactive art lounge" gives you the chance to tap your artistic side. Bring some friends and your favorite bottle of wine and let the creativity flow.

ART ON THE BOULEVARD

Art on the Boulevard is a cooperative art gallery where a large group of artists presents paintings from traditional to abstract, as well as jewelry, photography and sculpture.

WILLIAM CAMPBELL CONTEMPORARY ART

This well-established gallery has been an advocate of new work by American artists for more than 40 years. The gallery shows a wide range of representational and abstract art, paintings and mixed media.



A LOST TREASURE

Operated by a former Dallas Cowboys cheerleader, model and actress, this boutique presents Western chic, upscale home décor and one-of-a-kind items from around the globe.

CARTER BOWDEN ANTIQUES

The ever-changing inventory makes shopping here an adventure. You're likely to see many antique religious items, as well as Italian furniture and decorative arts from the 18th to the 20th centuries.

THE VILLAGE AT CAMP BOWIE

This large retail center includes stores like Stanley Eisenman's Shoes, Babies on the Boulevard, and Toy Works, which specializes in educational toys.

WRIGHT AT HOME

Peacock Alley Linens, Kravet Furniture and a range of home accents and gifts are featured at this finely merchandised store on the bricks of Camp Bowie.



MORRIS BERNEY PARK

Snuggled into a quiet residential neighborhood off Camp Bowie Boulevard, this triangular park is nearly four acres of fun, with a playground, benches and a big field.



VETERANS MEMORIAL PARK

This small park is located on the site of the World War I-era military camp the street is named for. It features historical markers, an inspiring monument and an anchor from the USS Fort Worth.

THE BRICKS

Beautiful and a little bumpy, the most famous stretch of Camp Bowie Boulevard is paved with red bricks created in Thurber, Texas. They were first installed in the 1920s and 1930s.

BIKE SHARING

There's a B-Cycle station at the UNT Health Science Center at Camp Bowie and Will Rogers Road.



HIDDEN GEM

Keeping Fort Worth healthy for decades, the Sunflower Shoppe offers an impressive selection of delightful body care products, aromatic essential oils and all the specialty products for gluten-free and vegan lifestyles, with exceptional customer service, too.




SELFIE STOP

Head to Kincaid's Hamburgers, a landmark since 1946, and pose either beneath the vintage "Chas. Kincaid Gro. Market" sign over the front door or head inside and grab a pic while you eat a two-fisted burger, wrapped in an old-fashioned white wrapper, as you stand at one of the antique grocery shelves to eat in the traditional fashion. **#FortWorthSelfie**

TMS / ALLIANCE

This growing area just north of downtown offers high-speed thrills at Texas Motor Speedway and shopping fun at one of the largest sports and outdoors stores in North Texas.



CABELA'S

For outdoor types, Cabela's is pure paradise, with everything you could possibly need for hunting, fishing and camping. You'll also find a variety of large displays, from aquariums to trophy animals.



BUREAU OF ENGRAVING AND PRINTING

You're literally in the money at this place — the only of its kind outside Washington, D.C. — where you can see billions of dollars being printed under your feet. Take the free tour and view interactive exhibits and displays showcasing currency history and manufacturing.



TEXAS MOTOR SPEEDWAY

Known as "The Great American Speedway," this is one of the best and largest sports stadiums in the U.S. Check out the action on Big Hoss - the world's largest high-definition video board.

NEARBY

Beyond the established districts, there's lots to see and do, from live theatre and drive-in movies to big-time shopping.



KEYS LOUNGE

Owned by a veteran bluesman, this juke joint books excellent local talent as well as marquee national acts.

STAGECOACH BALLROOM

Located near downtown on Belknap, the Stagecoach is one of the last authentic country and western ballrooms in the state. At 3,500 square feet, the dance floor provides plenty of room to two-step.



HULEN MALL

Fort Worth's largest mall, Hulen Mall is located on the southwest side of the city and anchored by Dillard's, Sears and Macy's.

MONTGOMERY STREET ANTIQUE MALL

When you enter here, be ready to stay awhile. Located just off I-30 at Montgomery, this place is enormous, with wall-to-wall antiques, collectibles and furniture of every description.

RIDGMAR MALL

Located in west Fort Worth near the Camp Bowie District, Ridgmar Mall is home to one of the world's best-known luxury retailers, Neiman Marcus, as well as Old Navy and JCPenney.

NEARBY

HIP POCKET THEATRE

Now in its 38th season, Hip Pocket Theatre is an experimental theatre ensemble that stages wildly entertaining works in a rustic outdoor setting, including original plays, fantasies and fables, and adaptations.

CLIFF HOUSE STUDIO AND GALLERY

Located on Eagle Mountain Lake, classes, workshops and tours are available at this home where a husband-and-wife team create gorgeous ceramic and glass art.



ARTSPACE 111

Located on the edge of downtown, Artspace 111 was started by brothers Daniel and Dennis Blagg and has become one of the area's top galleries for emerging and mid-career artists.



COYOTE DRIVE-IN

A howling success since it opened, Coyote Drive-In shows a double feature on three screens nightly. View movies from your car, or bring a blanket and watch under the stars.



AMERICAN AIRLINES C.R. SMITH MUSEUM

Located near DFW Airport, the C.R. Smith Museum is all about the magic of airplane flight, with hands-on exhibits, fullscale aircraft engines, historical artifacts, even a rare DC-3 airliner.



SELFIE STOP

Head to Arlington's AT&T Stadium, where the Dallas Cowboys play football in their \$2 billion home, and find the sculpture suspended overhead in the main concourse of the southeast entry. Stand beneath the sculpture called *Coin Toss*, a stranded cable piece of art measuring 14 feet in diameter and 45 feet wide. **#FortWorthSelfie**





FORT WORTH NATURE CENTER AND REFUGE

One of the largest in the country, this tranquil nature center boasts 3,621 acres of forests, prairies and wetlands, along with more than 20 miles of hiking trails.

LA GRAVE FIELD

Just north of downtown, La Grave Field is the home of the Fort Worth Cats, who play United League Baseball. Enthusiastic crowds root for the home team while enjoying marvelous views of the city.

A TRUE SPORTS TOWN



Bragging Rights

> The PGA's Crowne Plaza Invitational has been held in Fort Worth since 1946 at Colonial Country Club.





Fun adventures can be found just a short drive outside Fort Worth. Spend a day in these fun and quirky destinations, and then rest your head back in the city.

Clifton

A 90-minute drive south from Fort Worth leads to Clifton, a town on the Bosque River. Find beautiful hand-painted furniture in the Norwegian Collection at the **Bosque Museum** and a stunning assortment of fine art of the American West at the Bosque Arts Center. Downtown offers the restored **1916 Cliftex Theatre**, still showing first-run films. Grab lunch at **Bunkhouse BBQ** and taste award-winning wines at **Red Caboose Winery**.

Hico

Just 90 minutes southwest of Fort Worth, this hamlet is rumored to have been the last hideout for Billy the Kid. Make time to shop at **Blue Star Trading** and **Homestead** for home furnishings; **Wiseman House Chocolates** for handcrafted sweets; and **E is for Ice Cream** and **Texas Wines and Cheeses**.



Fossil Rim Wildlife Center

Just over an hour's drive, this 1,700-acre preserve features more than 1,000 endangered animals from five continents. Photograph giraffes, white rhinos, cheetahs, gray zebras and wildebeest as you drive the scenic 9.5-mile route. Then opt for a hike or picnic on the ranch, or head to nearby Loco Coyote for exceptional barbecue and burgers.

Granbury

The first county downtown in Texas — only 40 minutes south of Fort Worth — to undergo major restoration, the **Hood County Courthouse Square** is a showplace, with everything from antique stores and tearooms to a beautifully renovated opera house, whose playbill stays packed with performances.





Albany

A two-hour drive west of Fort Worth lands you in the Shackelford County seat, home to the **Old Jail Art Center**. After touring the remarkable pre-Columbian collection and artworks by luminaries such as Pablo Picasso and Henry Moore, enjoy a meal at the **Icehouse** or the **Beehive Restaurant and Saloon**.



Arlington

It's an easy 20-minute drive to Arlington, where you can book a tour of AT&T Stadium, the \$2 billion home of the Dallas Cowboys. 
