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Association Profile: NIRSA comprises and supports leaders in collegiate recreation. As college and university students develop into future leaders, NIRSA members support their learning and growth by fostering lifelong habits of wellbeing. Leadership, teamwork, dedication, and respect are among the many skills exercised by inclusive competition, fitness, and recreation. Since its founding in 1950, NIRSA membership has grown to comprise nearly 4,500 dedicated professionals, students, and businesses, serving an estimated 8.1 million students. NIRSA believes that collegiate recreation is a significant and powerful key to inspiring wellness in local, regional, and global communities. Our network of passionate professional and student members drives the association through volunteer leadership and is supported by the NIRSA team at headquarters, based in Corvallis, Oregon. The rich environment of inclusive competition, sportsmanship, and professional development—from participants to fans to volunteers—supports communities of health and wellness, which is what NIRSA is all about. NIRSA conducts approximately 40 regional and national championships each academic year.

Event Overview: The NIRSA National Soccer Championships began in 1994 for collegiate sport club teams. These teams from across the country are supported mainly by the Campus Recreation Department and compete in leagues outside the university. Participant demographics: 50% men, 50% women; average age is 20; age range is approximately 18 to 25; extremely healthy. The NIRSA National Soccer Championships is conducted as a National Event to crown a collegiate sport club champion.

Tournament Venue:

- Space #1: A minimum of 16 lighted soccer fields measuring a minimum length of 100 yards (110 yards preferred) and a minimum width of 70 yards (75 yards preferred), complete with field painting, goals, nets, corner flags, team benches, and bleacher seating for 25/field.
- Space #2: Saturday, early afternoon-evening. Event finals on one field, with event seating for 500, lighting, PA system, and electronic scoreboard. Stadium preferred, can be one of the fields that are used during the tournament.
- Tournament Desk: 20 X 20 covered area for game management
- Official Area: 30 X 30 covered area for shade and dining (includes tables and chairs)
- Trainers Area: 10 X 10 covered area for every 4-6 cluster of fields
- Tournament Merchandise Area: up to three 10 X 10 covered area with table, chairs and access to Wi-Fi

Lodging Requirements: Host hotel with 5 miles of the venue and 500 hotel rooms within a 12-15 miles radius.
